### Opening of Admission Portal, 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase

#### Notice inviting online application for the Admission in the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester Classes for the Academic Year 2024-25

Admission process of City College is online. The link for admission portal is provided as per government instruction.

**Admission Portal for 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase Application will remain open from 4.00 pm of 20.09.2024 to 11.59pm of 23.09.2024.**

**Link of the application portal will be available in the City College website from 4.00 pm of 08.09.2024.**

**Provisional merit list for the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of application will be published on 24.9.2024. Merit list of 1<sup>st</sup> phase, if any, stands cancelled. Student seeking admission in City College has to apply afresh in the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase.**

#### A. General information for the applicants

1. ALL ADMISSIONS ARE PROVISIONAL, SUBJECT TO SCRUTINY AND APPROVAL OF UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.
2. All students who have passed their 12<sup>th</sup> standard qualifying examinations from Boards/Councils approved by CU are eligible to apply.
3. APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED WITH FALSE OR, FAKE INFORMATION AND ON WRONG/IMPROPER DOCUMENTATION ARE LIABLE TO BE CANCELLED AND NO REFUND OF APPLICATION AND/OR, ADMISSION FEES WOULD BE MADE AFTERWARDS.
4. Candidates may apply for more than one subject with separate application form.
5. Please see the Guidelines for filling On-line Application Form before submission of application form.
6. Application fee: Nil.
7. Reserved category applicants should possess specific valid certificate from approved authority (only of West Bengal)
8. SC/ST/OBC/EWS applicants from OTHER STATES will be considered as GENERAL CANDIDATES.
9. OBC candidates should possess valid Certificate from competent authority of West Bengal Government mentioning their category A or B.

10. Candidates are not required to submit any print copy of Application Form/ Bank Receipt/ other documents in the College during the period of on-line application as well as admission process. **Physical presence in College is not required at any stage in the admission process.**
11. **Once submitted, there will be no provision for rectification in the application form; if necessary the candidate can apply for a second time within the stipulated date.**
12. **CANDIDATES MUST RESPOND TO OUR NOTICE ON “ONLINE EXPRESSION OF WILLINGNESS” IN ORDER TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION AFTER PUBLICATION OF MERIT LIST.**
13. **No physical presence will be required at the college before starting of their classes.**

15. **DIFFERENTLY ABLED CANDIDATES:** Such candidates must possess and upload the relevant disability certificate issued by a competent authority as per government norms.
16. **Refund policy will be as per Govt. directive.**

### **Very Important!!!**

After publication of provisional merit list there will be **online expression of willingness** by the applicants. They have to log in into City College Admission portal and have to put a ✓ in the box against their name. Failing to do so will automatically cancel their candidature and their name will be permanently deleted from the provisional merit list. No further request from the candidates to include their name in the provisional merit list will be entertained by the college authority.

Such online expression of willingness is necessary for speedy admission process. Therefore, online expression of willingness will be conducted multiple times during admission process. Hence, applicants are requested to visit college website/admission portal **at list twice daily** after publication of provisional merit list to know the time schedule for the online expression of willingness.

2. CSR/05/2023, dated 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2023 (For 4 year BA & BSc Major Programme with or without research that is equivalent to erstwhile BA & BSc Hons) and
3. CSR/06/2023, dated 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2023 (For 4 year BCom Hons with or without research and 3 year BCom that is equivalent to erstwhile BCom Hons & BCom Pass respectively)

**Note:** Here the term *Top 4* denotes marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

**Tie Breaking Rule:** Marks obtained in English in 10+2. Higher the marks, higher the position in merit list.
